

### From the Desk of the Director



Fall is here. Some of us who have been dealing with a rather warm summer may be a bit more excited about that fact.

Fall means a lot of things in our wonderful state. The leaves turning beautiful colors, the earth transitioning toward winter, the first snowfall, Halloween, All Saints Day, Thanksgiving, Our Lady of Guadalupe celebrations and much more.

It is also a time to give thanks. And our deacon community has much to be grateful for. This past month we were able to gather for the first time in seven years for retreat. Most of us had that experience provided for by our parishes who clearly appreciate our ministry.

I am grateful for the opportunity to serve not only as a deacon, but as the director of the Deacon Office and of Deacon Formation. Serving our archbishop by serving you is an honor and certainly a privilege. Of course, I am also grateful for you and the ministry you provide.

The results of the survey we conducted earlier this year are quite revealing. Did you know that 60% of us get absolutely no compensation for our ministry – not even reimbursement for expenses! You are a blessing to the Church, and I want to know that your ministry is greatly appreciated.

The survey also confirmed what we already suspected – our diaconate is aging. The vast majority of deacons who completed the survey (thanks to the 144 of you who did that!) are over the age of 60, with nearly half being over the age of 70. This speaks strongly to the need for us to recruit younger men for holy orders. The good news is that we will be ordaining some younger men this next June and we have several aspirants who are in their early 40s.

A summary of the survey results is located on page 8 of this newsletter.

I invite all of us to spend some time reflecting on what we have to be grateful for. God is the source of all that we have and all that we are.





### Deacons, Should You be a CRS Global Fellow?



Catholic Relief Services (CRS) is looking for permanent deacons who would like to serve the Universal Church as CRS Global Fellows. CRS follows the example of Jesus Christ, assisting those who are poor and suffering

in more than 100 countries on the basis of need, without regard to race, religion or nationality. As the official international humanitarian agency of the United States Catholic Church, CRS works overseas with the local Church, partners, and program participants to build stronger, more resilient communities while promoting the sacredness and dignity of all human life. The work of CRS is overseen by the USCCB.

The CRS Global Fellows program provides an opportunity for permanent deacons and priests to engage in this crucial work of the Church.

The Global Fellows program is for permanent deacons in good standing who are:

- Passionate about linking the global work of the Catholic Church to Catholics in the U.S.
- Open to learning about global hunger and climate change.
- Able to preach/present at minimum three times a year within their diocese on global solidarity and the mission of CRS (paid travel outside of diocese as optional).
- Willing to engage in legislative advocacy and facilitating community giving.
- Interested in occasional travel overseas to observe and participate in the work of CRS.

The deadlines to apply to be a CRS Global Fellow are September 30th and March 30th each year. ## Survey Results

A survey of deacons in the Archdiocese of Santa Fe was conducted in the spring of 2024. It was conducted online utilizing a standard form; however, a few responders were assisted in completing the survey. 144 deacons (out of approximately 200) completed the survey (72%).

The respondents were mostly active deacons residing in the Archdiocese of Santa Fe. It is an older demographic. The vast majority (74%) are over the age of 60 and 36% are over the mandatory age of retirement (70). However, most (58%)of the respondents were ordained within the past 15 years. More than half live in the greater Albuquerque area (Deaneries A, B and C).

This portrait of the diaconate in the archdiocese reveals a majority (65%)of our deacons identify as Hispanic/Latino. The second largest ethnicity is Caucasian/white (29%). There are more Asian/Pacific Islanders than there are Native Americans.



Our deacons are generally well educated with 60% holding college degrees and almost 40% holding a graduate degree. 10% hold a graduate degree in a religious field.

Deacons provide a great deal of both parochial and extra parochial ministry and most of that is provided for free. 75% provide at least 5 hours of ministry in their parish with only 40% receiving any type of compensation. 72% also have a ministry outside of their parish.

Deacons are involved in a wide variety of ministries both within and outside of the parish. While the parish involvement of the deacons is mostly in faith formation, their ministry outside of the parish centers more on outreach to the poor and the sick.

In close coordination with Archbishop John C. Wester and in union with deacons throughout the Archdiocese of Santa Fe, the results of this survey are intended to help the Deacon Personnel Board recommend better informed decision options for Archbishop Wester's consideration, as needed. The survey results have both revealed and affirmed resource management and demographic challenges that we plan to better assess and address in near future. Your participation in this survey has been extremely helpful and we thank you for your cooperation and patience as we collectively strive to best serve the people of our Archdiocese in the spirit of "Diakonia" and our ongoing "Rebuild My Church" endeavor.



### St. Stephen Fund



This fund is established according to the Archdioceses of Santa Fe bylaws and constitution. It is an approved fund for the designated purpose of giving financial assistance to Permanent Deacons and/or their wives. The St Stephen Fund is intended to be temporary assistance during a time of crisis or when grave financial need has been identified. Assistance from the fund is intended to be a one-time gift, but under certain circumstances the St Stephen Fund Committee may decide to help on more then one occasion. The Permanent Deacon or widow requesting assistance must complete a Request for Assistance form and send to the St Stephen Fund Committee for review and then forward to the Office of the Director of Deacons for action.

### **Deacon Council Update**

At the recent Deacon Community Retreat, revisions to the Deacon Council Constitution were unanimously approved. The changes affect the membership of the Deacon Council, making it

easier to fill vacancies and increasing the size of the council so that it more accurately reflects the members of the deacon community. For example, at-large members will be appointed from among the deacon wives, senior (over the age of 70) deacons, newly ordained deacons, etc. While the Constitution still calls for representatives to be elected by their deaneries, it allows for appointment of representatives in the event the deanery fails to elect in a timely fashion.



The Deacon Council is currently on suspension while it is being reformed. The hope is to resume regular meetings in 2025. If you are interested in serving as a representative on the Deacon Council, please contact Dcn. Keith Davis at the Deacon Office.



# Revised Rite for Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharistic Mystery Outside of Mass

The USCCB has issued a new rite for "communion services" as well as adoration and benediction. The rite is to be promulgated this year on the First Sunday of Advent. Ritual books are now available via most major publishers.

The new rite for holy communion outside of Mass does not include a lot of changes, but will help ministers with a more uniform ritual. It is rather simple. There is no procession. The deacon, vested in alb and stole, will be seated in the sanctuary and simply begins with the greeting. After the greeting, the minister leads a penitential act. There is no collect, so the rite goes immediately to the readings of the day, a short homily, and the Universal Prayer. After the Blessed Sacrament is placed on the altar (a corporal should have been placed ahead of time), the Lord's Prayer is said followed by a sign of peace. The deacon then takes a host and shows it to the assembly saying: "Behold the Lamb of God...."




After communion is distributed, there is a prayer after communion (there are several options available) and concludes with a blessing and dismissal. He then simply leaves the sanctuary after reverencing the altar (and genuflecting toward the tabernacle if it is present).

It is interesting that the only mention of music is during the communion rite.

**Sunday Celebrations in the Absence of a Priest (SCAP)** have not changed since the last revision in 2014, Note that the new rite of Holy Communion Outside of Mass is very different from the SCAP ritual. SCAP should NEVER be used for Holy Communion Outside of Mass—it is reserved for the Sunday Celebration only.

**Adoration and Benediction** largely remain the same. Benediction begins with the hymn Tantum Ergo (or another Eucharistic song) while the monstrance is incensed. After a call to prayer, a collect is said. Then the Deacon puts on the humeral veil, genuflects, and makes the Sign of the Cross over the people with the Blessed Sacrament.




The Divine Praises are said prior to placing the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle. After the Blessed Sacrament has been placed back in the Tabernacle, the deacon genuflects while the people sing a hymn. He then leaves.
