ARCHDIOCESE OF SANTA FE 11 TO 15 (including the driver)-Passenger Van, Bus and Shuttle Use Policy

The Archdiocese of Santa Fe has adopted the following policy governing the purchasing and usage of 11 to 15 (including the driver) passenger van, bus and shuttle is as follows:

USAGE OF 11 TO 15 PASSENGER VANS

- New or used 11 to 15 passenger vans <u>must not</u> be purchased or leased (including short-term leases such as 1-2 weeks) for the transportation of passengers.
- Volunteers who own 11 to 15 passenger vans <u>must not</u> be allowed to use these vehicles while in an agency relationship with a Parish, School, or Organization of the Archdiocese, such as Youth or Religious Education Ministries, or for field trips.
- 11-15 passenger vans can be replaced with either a school bus or a Multifunction School Activity Bus (MFSAB). A MFSAB is a vehicle which complies with the Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards (FMVSS) applicable to school buses for crash survivability. If a MFSAB is used for the transportation of children, these vehicles must meet FMVSS 111; FMVSS 220; FMVSS 221 and FMVSS 222 (see below). If purchasing a MFSAB to transport children, it is important to confirm with the seller that the vehicle meets all four FMVSS. There are vehicles that visually appear to be conforming, but are not.
- Mini-vans may continue to be used to transport children and/or adults. A minivan is defined as a passenger vehicle designed to transport no more that 8 total occupants.

Below are the four FMVSS referred to in the above policy. Additional information on how to determine if a bus or shuttle meets FMVSS standards can be obtained from Catholic Mutual's Risk Management Department at (800) 228-6108.

FMVSS 111 - Fulfills the safety requirement for the rear-view and cross-view visibility.

FMVSS 220 - Establishes requirements for the school bus body structure in rollover accidents.

FMVSS 221 - Regulates the strength of body panel joints in school buses.

FMVSS 222 - Establishes occupant protection requirements for school bus passenger seating and barriers.

Important Note: Vans, Buses and Shuttle Buses capable of transporting 16 plus passengers must also comply with the above FMVSS.

DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS (D & O) LIABILITY COVERAGE

Included in the parish liability coverage, D & O coverage exists for Finance Council members as well as other parish sponsored committees.

Catholic Mutual provides coverage for all Directors and Officers of Archdiocesan educational, charitable, and religious boards operated and controlled by the Archdiocese. This coverage is in effect while the Directors and Officers are engaged in Church business.

PERSONNEL TERMINATION

Parishes and Schools must consult with the Archdiocesan Human Resources Director or the Archdiocesan Attorney <u>before</u> a termination takes place. This is a requirement of our insurance carrier in regards to coverage.
